Some of the lowest growing natives are included in this garden. Groundcovers help keep away weeds and also create cohesion in the landscape as a solid "floor" of low plants. Pussytoes is an important host plant for certain fritillaries, has soft grey green foliage and grows 3-6". Dwarf Blazing Star has pink fuzzy flowers in late summer and pairs well with the Nodding Onion and Whorled Milkweed as all grow to 1.5'. Prairie Dropseed is a low, flattened mop-head grass that stays about 1.5' tall until flowering when the flower stalks reach 3.5'. Horsemint is related to Bee Balm and is an amazing pollinator magnet with interesting flowers!

Pollinator gardens are a great concept, even though in all practicality, all gardens are pollinator gardens. With that understood, this kit has the best native plants that attract bees, flies, butterflies, dragonflies, beetles, ants, hummingbirds, and more! Full sun is best and soil type is not a worry. Bee Balm and Joe Pye Weed can grow in light shade. Blooming starts with Bee Balm and ends with Aster. This garden kit supplies food from June to October. Boneset, Hairy Mountainmint, Stiff Goldenrod and Bee Balm all grow to about 4' tall while Purple Giant Hyssop and Joe Pye Weed can attain 5-6' heights.

Try this wonderful mix of species in hues of blue/purple to create a complementary color scheme. Plants will also work well mixed into existing beds. All species prefer full sun to light shade and will tolerate all soil conditions except boggy. Hairy Beardtongue grows to 1' and makes a good self seeding groundcover, blooms in May/June. Blue Lobelia tops out at 3' and is a great bee plant, blooms in late summer. Purple Coneflower and Blue False Indigo average 3.5-4'. Purple Giant Hyssop and New England Aster grow in a range of 3-5'. Purple Coneflower, Purple Giant Hyssop, and New England Aster are important pollinator and bird plants.

Purple Prairie Plants Benefits: Bees, butterflies, hummingbirds birds. Leave plants in place to over winter.

This kit is for low, wet places in the landscape or rain garden applications. Blue Mistflower grows to 2.5' and spreads by rhizomes to form a groundcover. Nodding onion grows to 1.5' with dainty, drooping pink flowers late in summer. Clustered Mountainmint grows to 3.5', attracts all pollinators. The yellow flowers of Shrubby St. Johns Wort appear in summer and add nice visual interest. This kit also contains Rose Milkweed that supplies nectar and a place for Monarch's to reproduce. Ironweed can be rather tall at 7', this depends on overall moisture each year. The dark purple flowers turn to showy seed puffs for winter interest. Full Sun.

Benefits: Bees, butterflies, monarch, hummingbirds, birds. Leave plants in place to over winter.

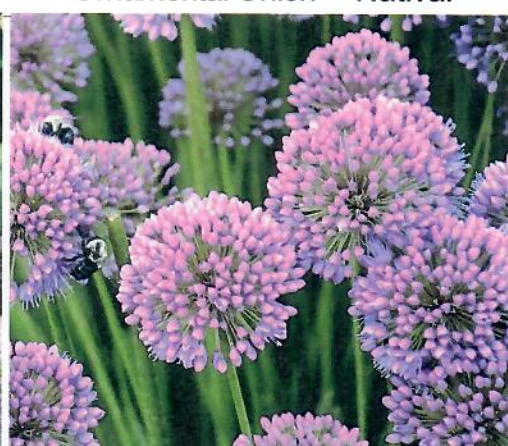

Long blooming fragrant flowers with burgundy calyces that cover the top 2/3's of the plant from mid to late summer. New foliage emerges burgundy in spring. Even after the blooms subside, the colorful calyces remain, extending the color season. Foliage has a mint scent. Leave over winter for seed gathering birds.

Of course it's most important to SW Michigan's Monarch butterflies & caterpillars. Gather seeds in fall for winter sowing.

Leaves are a food source for SW Michigan's Monarch butterfly larvae (caterpillars).

A popular native perennial with striking summer flowers of bright pink rays and spiny orange cones. Long-lasting flowers that bloom profusely all summer. Plants are low maintenance and resilient, thriving in most sunny sites due to their strong stems and deep roots. Leave fall seed heads over the winter for birds to

Butterflies and song bird favorite.

Here's a new take on the Coneflower. Free-flowering, long-blooming, showy perennial that blooms early summer to early fall. The large, semidouble flowers are a stunning shade of apple green with a dark green center cone that matures to lemon yellow. Leave fall seed heads over the winter for the birds to gather.

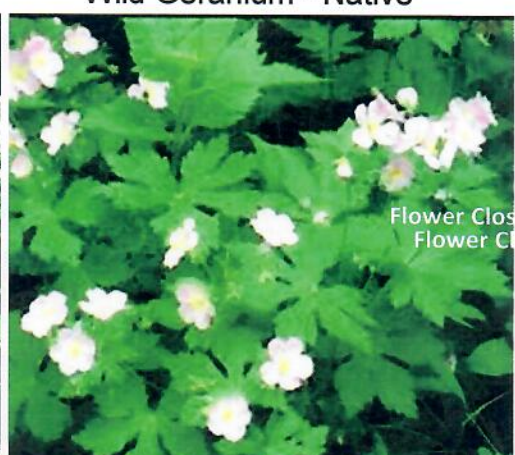

A larger Sea Holly with arresting electric blue flowers that will reach 4" diameter with bracts that surround the flower's blue center cone. Has green thistle-like silver foliage as well! An excellent cut flower, fresh or dried. A rugged plant that offers both texture and color in the garden.

Attracts butterflies, deer & rabbit resistant.

A very architectural perennial, perfect for the back of a border with showy flat-topped clusters of white vanilla scented flowers. Sturdy upright stem clumps, somewhat vase shaped. Attractive foliage over winter with seed heads for birds. Superior resistance to powdery mildew. Developed by the Chicago Botanic Gardens.

Bright lavender flowers are a favorite and retains its attractive foliage all season long. Plants expand to form a nice clumps that also work well as a weed suppressing groundcover. As woodland native, does prefer shade, but it will grow in the sun in a rich soil that is consistently damp. Very long lived plant, some minor self sowing.

Dome shaped plant with a unique leaf shape and pretty magenta flowers. A rhizomatous semi-evergreen perennial that typically spreads to 24" wide to form a thick, weed-resistant ground cover. Ideal for underplanting trees or shrubs. Easily spreads without being aggressive. Excellent deer resistance, with the added benefit of lovely red-tinted foliage in the fall.

Biggest Lavender blooms yet! Compact mounds of grey-green, fragrant foliage and intense purple flower wands. Can be particularly effective when massed. Remove faded flowers to promote continued bloom. This is a good variety to use as an edger. Good drainage is needed especially in the winter. Use fresh or dried in bouquets and sachets. Deer/rabbit resistant.

Prized 30" multiple flower spikes growing from compact, clump-forming green grass like base. Liatris is a very strong vertical accent and 'Kobold' is one of the best selections available for border gardens. It is a staple item for cutting gardens; it adds a bright, vertical element to bouquets. Leave spikes in place over winter for interest and seeds for the birds. Easy to grow.

Few perennials can produce this brilliant shade of cardinal red. Foliage is a hardy green that turns bronze-purple in the fall. Unmistakable perennial for moist spots. A top performer, blooms for a month or more in late summer, perfect as a late summer pollinator food source. Also good for cut flowers but stems have a milky sap.

Darkest, truest purple flowers of any cultivar. Its upright, rigid stems create a strongly vertical aesthetic while the dull green leaves have a rough, fragrant sand-papery texture. Because of these traits, 'Purple Rooster' does have a slightly different look compared most of the other bee balms. Tested high for mildew resistance.

New in 2022 this plant stands out among catmints for; long bloom period, perfect middle ground size - not huge, not dwarf. It also reaches its mature height quickly and maintains a neatly mounded habit thanks to its upright stems. Known for its larger flowers & mint-scented foliage. Plus not attractive to rabbits and deer.

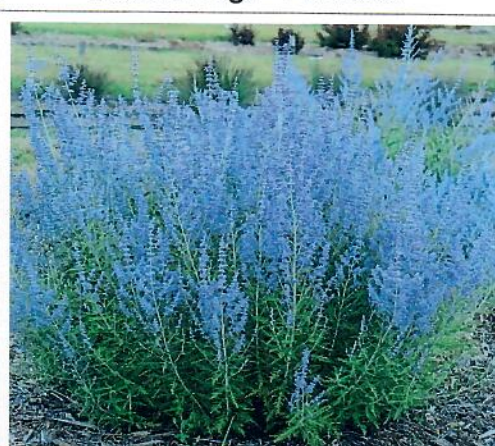

An improved Catmint - petite, sweet and easy to grow. Long blooming! As flowers begin to fade, the rosy purple calyxes remain to supply an additional splash of color. The foliage is a rich green and fragrant, but the blooms are what steal the show. Nepeta are idea for rock gardens, containers and border fronts. One of the best plants to edge or under plant a rose bed.

Glossy bronze-red foliage is topped with masses of large, light pink flowers. Followed by seed heads that are held over wine-red foliage. Compared to 'Husker's Red', this tall beauty has much darker foliage which stays darker through the season. A tough, carefree plant which tolerates high heat and humidity. A perfect dark background plant for the border.

Thrives in the heat of summer – the cloud of smoky-blue blooms is unforgettable! One of the earliest Perovskia to bloom, is stunning when paired with Rudbeckia and Echinacea. Compact, bushy mound with fragrant silver foliage. Perovskia blooms on gray-green aromatic foliage. Heat and drought tolerant and perfectly sized for most garden spaces. top-rated by Chicago Botanic Garden.

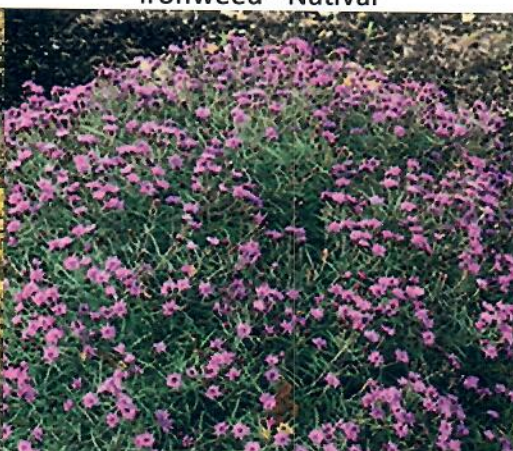

2023 Perennial Plant of the year - bright, golden-yellow flowers with black centers and arched petals. Grows in a dome-like shape up to 2' wide. This is a flower powerhouse that produces masses of blossoms from July to September here in Michigan, with some color until frost. Deadhead for more blooms. Bred for its resistance to septoria leaf spot. Destined to be the new staple for landscapes!

Consider by Chicago Botanic Gardens as one of the best performing native perennials. Dark purple, airy cluster flowers nearly cover up the purple-tinged fine textured narrow foliage. Compact, tough, disease resistant, clump forming native perennial that provides much needed late summer and fall nectar for pollinators. Drought resistant once established.

This stately back of the border native has strikingly colorful flower spikes. Deep lilac flowers opening from red-purple buds sit on top of tall stems, with lots of side shoot flowers. Dark green leaves and reddish stems. Make for dramatic cut flowers. Offers a long season of interest. Deadhead flower spikes for increased reblooming.

Clump forming perennial sedge with narrow grass-like arching leaves. Grows in dense mounded tufts and spread slowly via underground rhizomes and gradually form colonies. Carex seed pods (flowers) are held on stems above the foliage - green to tan with tinges of purple. This sedge tolerates shade and drought and is an excellent selection for difficult dry shaded sites.

A rhizomatous sedge that matures into compact mounded clumps. The shiny deep green foliage is evergreen and up to 8" long. In late spring interesting green flower spikes are displayed above the leaves. This sedge has great landscape potential as a groundcover for woodlands or shade gardens. The unique leaf texture allows this sedge to serve as an eye catching accent.

Unique golden sedge well-suited for moist or wet areas. Can tolerate drier soils if planted in the shade. Color most spectacular in full sun. The fine-textured leaves are striped sporadically with bright green lines, which will turn lime green when planted in shade. Magnificent planted in masses. Can also be used in the landscape as a dramatic specimen plant or in decorative container.

Handsome semi-evergreen clumps of fine textured arching foliage. Blades are less than 1/4" wide and up to 16" long. The soft blue grayish-blue color foliage has a frosted appearance. In early summer cream colored floret spikes appear followed by tan seed clusters. Slowly expands from underground rhizomes to form small patches.

Slender, bright green leaves, with strong creamy white margins that sway in the wind. Spreads to create a dense mat of arching semi-evergreen foliage. Great choice for Asian inspired gardens, as weed suppressing groundcover or in containers. BUT perhaps the most useful plant for dry shade, and erosion control. Easy grow.

New improved version of Pennsylvania Sedge is a dappled-shade-lover has arching, soft, semi evergreen leaves that reach 8 inches. In late spring, masses of LARGE, wooly, yellow flower clusters rise above. Unlike most sedges, this beauty prefers loose DRY soil, rather than moist. It can creep slowly via rhizomes and, in optimal conditions, can seed itself.

Stiff extra fine foliage, and attractive, feathery buff-colored floret seed plumes complement the blue foliage and resemble wheat, creating an eye-catching contrast. Perfectly suited for edging borders, mass planting as a groundcover, and xeriscape gardens.

(PS—everyone asks about this plant in my Garden!)

Tends to be a heavy bloomer, clouds of seed heads makes this a great see-through plant. Tough, easy to grow grass that so adaptable that it can grow anywhere from a parking lot to a rain garden. Don't cut back until early spring, Panicums promise a lively winter show.

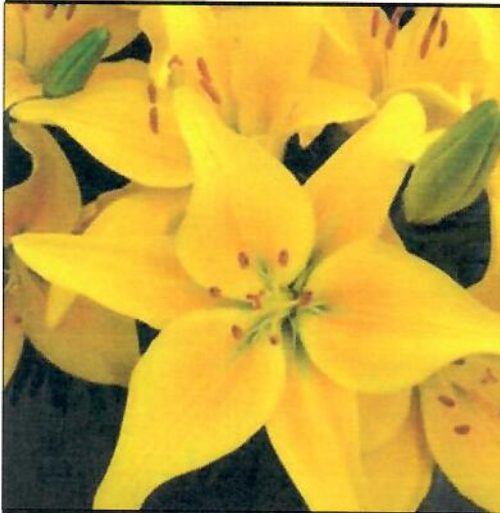
Exciting upright grass with strong blue foliage & flashes of maroon. In fall, hints of purple appear on the stems. In late summer silver flower plumes appear - fade to reddish-brown in the fall. Leave in place over winter to enjoy their motion in wind and snow. Tolerates black walnut, and a wide variety of soil types but needs very well-drained soils. Less prone to lodge than other Bluestem varieties.

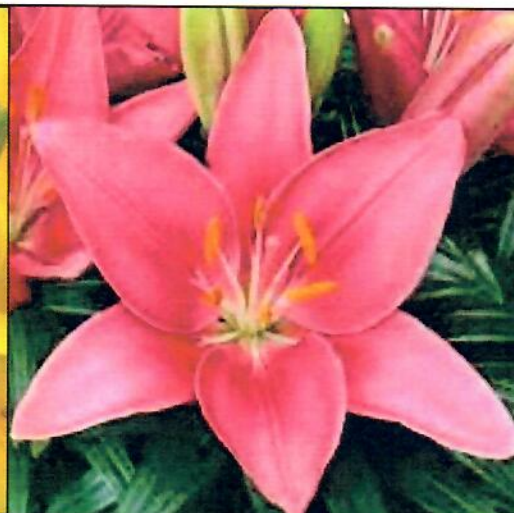
Our selection of Lilies are one of the more low-maintenance plants to cultivate. Spring plant in well-drained, compost enriched soil and they will return each spring for years. Like all herbaceous perennials these die back to the ground in winter and send up a new stems from the bulb each spring. When planting work the soil and plant bulb to a depth of 3x the ht of the bulb. This encourages sturdy root growth. Make a bigger impact by planting 3-4 bulbs per square foot. Remember flat side of bulb down, pointy end up when planting. Should be cut back in late fall in preparation for winter. Good pollinator plants for bees and hummingbirds.

Dwarf Lily Bulbs - 'Tiny' Series Bulb size 12-14 cm

Dwarf Tiny Lilies are a compact lily that bears well formed, upward facing blooms - perfect for containers or massing along borders. They are also known to have more multiple blooms per stem will grow than other lilies. Flower stems will be about 15 " tall at maturity, with a spread of 12 inches. When grown in masses or used as a bedding plant, individual bulbs should be spaced 10-15" apart. Does best in full sun to partial shade in average to evenly moist conditions These grow at a fast rate.

Oriental Lily Bulbs - Bulb size 16-18 cm

Oriental Lilies are known for their intense beauty and captivating, exotic fragrance. They are tall "late bloomers", as they typically bloom in the late summer season. Tolerant and easy to care for, they do well in a variety of locations but flourish in full to partial sun in rich, moist, well-drained soil. For more drama plant bulbs 9 to 12 inches apart. When mature up to 12 large flowers are produced on the end of each strong stem.
